The celebrations gave us an opportunity to reflect on the successes for gender equality in sport which have been made since the establishment of the IWG in Brighton back in 1994, but also serve as a stark reminder of the size of the challenge which remains and the importance of the IWG's work on a global basis.

We continue to make good progress against our strategy in driving the IWG forward. Across year two, we have seen more International Federations sign the Brighton plus Helsinki Declaration, increased collaboration with our global stakeholders and the completion of our foundational work for the Global Summit in 2026 ready for us to advance this further as we enter into year three.

We were also delighted to be able to capitalise on the Olympic and Paralympic year by hosting a 'Women in Sport' event at the British Ambassador's Residence in Paris during the Games. With our huge thanks to Dame Menna Rawlings, His Majesty's Ambassador to France, and UK Sport, we were able to bring together 150 senior leaders from International Federations and National Governing Bodies, Sports Ministers, Athletes and Media to share more information on the IWG and the purpose of the network.

We remain grateful to Sport England, UK Sport, the National Lottery, the Sport and Recreation Alliance, Sport Scotland, Sport Wales, University of Hertfordshire and the City of London Corporation for their ongoing support.

Created to assist sports rightsholders to capitalise on the growth in fan and investor engagement in women's sport, the programme provides access to specialist knowledge on topics including growing broadcast revenues, unlocking new audiences and best practice in working with investors, whilst networking events provide access to potential investors.

For the first time in IWG history, we provided financial support to advance the women and sport movement and promote inclusion, with thanks to the generosity of Dr Anita White CBE and colleagues at UK Sport who enabled the launch of the Anita White Fund (AWF)

The AWF consisted of:

- The Anita White Catalyst Grant for women who have completed leadership programmes to advance the women and sport movement.
- The Cath Sweet Award funded by UK Sport for women who wish to deliver programmes that promote social inclusion through sport with a focus on disability.
- 18 projects funded, delivering impact in 14 different countries.

We relaunched the IWG Insight Hub



Advocacy

IWG's commitment to influencing policy and strategy

This year we continued to influence policy and strategy through demonstrating the value and impact of systemic gender equality. We placed a focus on events and platforms that would enable us to share learning and influence the thinking of priority stakeholders and networks.

We also continued to promote the Brighton plus Helsinki Declaration, signing up new organisations committed to its principles and sharing learning through the network.
